■ what is “rights review”?

- › “rights review” is a quarterly newsletter produced by the Welfare Rights Centre Sydney.

■ what is the Welfare Rights Centre?

- › The Welfare Rights Centre is a community legal centre which specialises in Social Security and Family Assistance law, its administration and policy. The Centre provides free advice and advocacy on these matters. It is entirely independent of Centrelink.
- › The Centre was established in 1983, and was the first of its kind in Australia.

■ how will “rights review” help?

- › “rights review” will help you to keep up-to-date with Social Security changes and issues and will enable you to assist people with their Centrelink problems and knowing their rights.
- › It is written by staff at the Welfare Rights Centre who assist people everyday with Social Security and Centrelink problems.

■ each edition contains...

- › information on recent and proposed changes to Social Security law and policy;
- › practical advice on how to help people with their Centrelink problems – with a detailed feature on a particular problem in each edition;
- › news and comment about Social Security issues and Centrelink; and
- › recent cases handled by the Centre’s staff and how these cases can help you to assist people in similar situations.
